MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES

FOR RECLAMATION DISTRICT 1608 HELD WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 7, 2016

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 was held on December 7, 2016, at the law office of Neumiller & Beardslee, 509 W. Weber Avenue, 5th Floor, Stockton, California, at the hour of 8:00 a.m.

Item 1. Public Comment. President Panzer called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m. All Trustees were present.

Item 2. Approval of Minutes. Minutes of the special meeting of October 19, 2016, November 2, 2016 and November 21, 2016.

Upon motion duly made, seconded, (B. Tholborn/D. Meyers), and unanimously carried, the Trustees of Reclamation District approved the minutes of the special meeting of October 19, 2016, the minutes of the regular meeting of November 2, 2016 and the special meeting of November 21, 2016.

Item 3. Financial Report. Review, discuss, and accept financial report. Attorney Schroeder and Secretary Knight presented two financial reports. Due to Ms. Knight being away just prior to the November 2, 2016 meeting, she was unable to complete the Financial Report for that meeting. Therefore, that report, along with the current report for December 7th were available for review. Several questions arose with respect to Payroll Taxes and expenses exceeding the budget. There was also the question from Trustee Meyer regarding a \$20,000 discrepancy between the auditor's report and the fund balance from the County, which had been discussed at the November meeting. Ms. Knight and Attorney Schroeder will research both these items and report back her findings. The following bills, and warrants in payment of same, were approved:

(a) Approve and accept 2015-2016 Audit. Dan Schroeder presented this item and asked if there were any further questions with respect to the draft audit distributed at the November 2, 2016 meeting and reviewed by Trustees between that time and the present. Trustees were satisfied with the draft and approved it being put in final. Therefore,

Upon motion duly made, seconded (D. Meyers/B. Tholborn) and unanimously carried, the Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 approved the draft audit presented for fiscal year 2015-2016 and asked that it be put in final.

- Review and Discuss Long Term Budget Planning and Project Expenditure Plan. (b) Chris Neudeck noted that at this time, he had nothing to report on the plan. There had been an additional budget meeting that was attended by Drew Meyers, Dan Schroeder, and Joe Bryson. This meeting was set, as planned at that meeting, to go over the figures presented at the November 2, 2016 District Meeting. Mr. Neudeck said he had also met separately with Joe Bryson – working on refining services, labor and general expenses. He noted he is having difficulty with time issues as this project is taking a considerable amount of his time. He also noted that he likely will need to sit down with and take time to talk to the Accountants and look at the budget on a long term basis. Right now, he is looking at item by item and further refining items. He has broken up the engineering expenses into approximately ten different categories and that should make the expenses breakdown more realistic for Trustees and staff to review. He is also shortening the 2016-2026 Fiscal Year Budget Worksheet to a 10 year time frame and bringing the numbers to the end of the current District assessment. He noted that projections are hinging on reimbursements from the levee subventions program where the District is currently getting a 75% return on qualified submitted expenses. He reported they also need to take more time looking at the elections expenses and are going to be using the figures from a recent election for RD1614 as it is a similar urban District where there were a number of candidates running for election for a Trustee position. He can then insert that as a line item. It was noted by the Trustees that in recent history, there have been only 3 elections and perhaps using that figure on a regular basis every two years may be a bit high. These and other questions as posed above will be further considered and this item will be continued as more time is given to the input.
- (c) Discuss Sediment Removal Project and Cost Update. Mr. Neudeck reported that there are no further comments.

Item 4. Engineer's Report. Request for directions and approvals.

Mr. Neudeck noted that the signature of Trustee Panzer sign the on MT-2 form included in the agenda packet was necessary. He also noted that he did receive a letter from FEMA indicating that the most recent October 21st letter is the most current review of the accreditation of the review process and that submittal of data was just not thorough enough and that's why the District must submit documents. The six page letter on October 21st, they have indicated, is very thorough. There was a note that if there is a risk to the District it would be at the Five Mile Slough drainage water shed. It does expand out and is an outside impact of the District, however. After discussion,

It was moved, seconded (B. Tholborn/D. Meyers) and unanimously carried by the Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that Trustee Panzer, as President, be authorized to sign the MT-2 form on behalf of the District.

At this time, Chris Neudeck brought up another issue that has come to his attention. He noted that he has been speaking to Mike Cordoroli of Manteca. There is a mapping problem within the Lake System of the District. FEMA maps show the two lake system with coloring crayon and is unrated because of the lakes. If one puts a straight line through this area (although curved), it goes in and out and touches resident homes. This could be a problem with those homes when it comes to selling their properties and one homeowner has had such a problem when she was trying to sell her condominium which had the line going through her property, which showed her property tied into the unrated lake. She was considering coming to this meeting but did not attend. The attorney and engineer noted that Discovery Bay had the same situation with the straight lines that included the houses. The line needs to be kept off the houses. Mr. Schroeder indicated that the owners of the building where these meetings are have the same issue. It is in individualized cases where this will come up. It was stated that these areas were mapped wrong and said that it is in the back of everyone's mind and people won't see it until there is a change in the property ownership and new financing. Dr. Panzer asked, it this the District's problem or the ones who drew up the maps? The question is whether this can be remapped and it was stated that FEMA only remaps when congress authorizes the remapping. This is a wait and see situation.

- (a) Consider new permits requests from homeowners. None.
- (b) Authorize President to sign Letter of Map Revision Forms. see above. Passed.

Chris Neudeck said the District is facing serious issues regarding the homeless within the District. He noted that he and Mr. Bryson have been working on repairing fences so that people can't get through by cutting and the only way would be to go around or to climb. He said they are going to go to the Central Valley Flood Protection Board about the expenses the District is incurring as DWR says they are not going to pick up that expense for levee subventions reimbursements. Mr. Neudeck and Mr. Bryson are thinking of constructing some kind of fencing that has concrete footing so trespassers can't dig below either. They are also thinking of thickening the fence so there would be too much to cut. They say it is just not a good use of their

time and along with this, they are constantly picking up trash and even appliances. Both Mr. Neudeck and Mr. Bryson will present some estimates to get this work done, as well as places where this will be needed.

Mr. Neudeck also noted that drawings found showed there was a drainage pipe around SeaGull Lane that he and Mr. Bryson are researching. Mr. Bryson noted that Gabriel Banks has been digging up the area where the pipe appears to be laid (varying depths also) and because of the recent dig to a depth of eight feet, closed up the hole and compacted the dirt as it was not acceptable to leave this without putting up barriers. This was not the desired result at this time. They will continue their search for the pipe as this may have an impact on discovering why certain properties in this area are having issues with water drainage.

(c) <u>Approve Temporary Encroachment Permit with PG&E</u>. PG& E needs to replace a power pole and needs to obtain a temporary encroachment permit to get in there and do the work. The District is being asked to give them access to where the pole is. Mr. Bryson said the pole is by the weir. Upon discussion,

It was moved, seconded (B. Tholborn/D. Meyers) and unanimously carried by the Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that a Temporary Encroachment Permit with PG&E be approved.

Item 5. Levee Superintendent Report. Request for directions and approvals. Joe Bryson distributed his superintendent report and discussion occurred. Mr. Neudeck added additional information where RD1614 needs additional help and it was suggested they use Gabriel Banks for that District on a part time basis. This will be helpful to Mr. Banks if the work for RD1608 slows down.

Item 6. Newsletter. Approve and authorize mailing of District Fall 2016 Newsletter. The proposed newsletter was distributed and several comments and revisions were made. Afterwards, the Trustees authorized the finalization and mailing out of the newsletter. Ms. Buethe noted that it should be in the mail by the end of the next calendar week. Therefore,

It was moved, seconded (D. Meyers/B. Tholborn) and unanimously carried by the Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that the newsletter, as presented and edited, be approved and that the mailing out commence as soon as is possible.

- Item 7. Email Address. Discuss and give direction regarding District E-mail Address. After discussion, it was decided to not create an e-mail address for the District.
- Item 8. Emergency Plan. Review of Emergency Procedures. Attorney Schroeder need to have this item continued as the attorneys are not yet ready to do a presentation.
- Item 9. Report by Trustees on meetings attended and upcoming meetings. Request for direction. Drew Meyers noted that he had attended the budget meeting as discussed above.
