Item 1. Public Comment. Under Government Code Section 54954.3, members of the public may address the Board on any issue in the District's jurisdiction. The public may address any item on the agenda as it is taken up. Trustee Panzer brought up the flooding in the Houston, Galveston, and Corpus Christi areas in Texas due to Hurricane Harvey and said this is something we all need to keep in mind and the damages that can occur when these kind of weather conditions occur. Just a reminder that these kinds of things do happen and the District needs to be vigilant in doing its part.

Item 2. Approval of Minutes. Minutes of the regular meeting of July 12, 2017. After review,

It was moved, seconded (B. Tholborn/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that the minutes of the regular meeting of July 12, 2017 were approved as read.

Item 3. Financial Report. Review, discuss, and accept financial report. Jean Knight presented the financial reports. She noted that they were for the first two months of the new fiscal year and include the new budget with new line items. One question arose as to assessment monies reported and Ms. Knight said she would check with the Auditor's office.

It was moved, seconded (B. Tholborn/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that the Financial Reports be approved.

(a) <u>Report on RD 17 Litigation Appeal</u>. Dan Schroeder reported on this item and said that the Supreme Court opted not to take on the matter. Below is an excerpt from the May 3, 2017 meeting minutes discussing the lawsuit status at that time.

Mr. Schroeder discussed a lawsuit between Manteca Unified School District vs. Reclamation District 17 dealing with Proposition 218. The school district did not want to pay Proposition 218 assessments and filed the lawsuit against Reclamation District 17 who was having a Proposition 218 hearing. The school district prevailed in Superior Court. However, Reclamation District 17 appealed this decision and won the appeal. There could be a chance this decision could be appealed to the State Supreme Court but Mr. Schroeder said the school district would need to file a Petition and he is of the opinion that the Supreme Court would not accept the Petition.

#### Item 4. Engineer's Report. Request for directions and approvals.

- (a) Consider new permit requests from homeowners.
  - 1. 6201 Embarcadero Drive, Index No 17, Lot 1159, APN 098-370-01, permit for landscaping requested. Mr. Neudeck said that drawings of the property are not adequate and they are frustrated and said at this time, they could not approve the permit request and did not wish to do a conditional request as was suggested in the engineer's report. At this point, due to the inadequacies of the permit and drawings, it was decided that the District consider holding a special meeting to discuss this permit request along with the agenda item relating to the sediment removal project, as attorney Schroeder mentioned that this agenda item could not be discussed at this meeting as Trustee Meyers was not present and Trustee Tholborn has a conflict. The Trustees present thought this could work out and Attorney Schroeder's secretary communicate with the Trustees and staff to schedule this meeting.
  - 2. 3837 Fort Donelson Drive, Index No. 112, Lot 2253, APN 098-080-43, permit for a fence requested. The engineers have recommended approval of this permit application for an open type, see through fence construction on the toe of the levee. Therefore,

Upon motion duly made, seconded (B. Tholborn/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried, the Trustees of Reclamation District approved the permit for an open type, see through fence construction on the toe of the levee at 3827 Fort Donelson Drive, Index No. 112, Lot 2253, APN 098-080-43 for David and Nancy Oberholtzer.

II. FEMA mapping status: (Engineer's Report)

Mr. Neudeck reported on the request made by FEMA through Daven Patel, MT-2 Technical Manager, that San Joaquin County is affected by the revision requested by the District. FEMA is asking that the engineers provide community acknowledgment in the form of a letter stating that the county has reviewed the revision request and understands the effects of the revision on flooding conditions in the community, and that any existing or proposed structures to be removed from the Special Flood Hazard Area, the area that would be inundated by the flood having a 1-percent chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year (base flood) are reasonably safe from flooding and in the alternative, that an Application/Certification Form 1, entitled "Overview & Concurrence Form," signed by a county official. This whole request concerns the engineers as the last time this kind of thing was requested, the County asked for a peer reviewer and it took 6 months. Mr. Neudeck states, we are on the finish line and he gets this type of comment from the County. He noted that Mr. Buckman is the deputy director (John McGuire was laid off and is no longer there) and also said that the only person there is a Junior who doesn't understand the whole process. He said, it's just another hold-up and questions such as what to do you want me to transmit - do they want them electronically or hard copy. Also, who is going to pay for the peer reviewer? These concerns will be addressed further by the engineers and a report back on the status will be forthcoming.

- III. Sediment Removal Project. Not discussed at this meeting see above. (Engineer's Report)
- IV. Southwest Levee Raising Project Mr. Neudeck asked if the District wanted to start identifying these improvements. He said that maybe an appraiser would be helpful as there could be a problem with diminishment of property value. He needs help in directing him moving down this path. Will most be docks that will get replaced? Will they allow docks with rock underneath them? Do we build the dock or does homeowner do it and District reimburse? He said he needs to have a workshop with counsel and would like to move on this and that the District has to keep this on the front burner along with the sediment removal project. Dan Schroeder and Chris Neudeck said they will be meeting and discussing in further detail.
  - (b) Authorize engineer to proceed with sediment removal project consultant contracts to perform design, survey, mapping environmental conditions and permitting.
  - (c) Discussion and direction regarding sediment removal project disposal site issues.

Both of the above items will be discussed at a special meeting to be arranged for 1-2 weeks from this meeting.

Item 5. Levee Superintendent Report. Request for directions and approvals. Joe Bryson presented the report. On item 4., Plymouth and Swain – the fence was cut. Also there was a lot of graffiti under the freeway. He reported on some AT&T cable in ground and it goes up above. Is it still permitted, is it a hazard for the District - should he work around it? He doesn't want to chop off people's phones. It was suggested he get a photo and more information and ask Johnny Mack what he recalls. On Item 10, it is within District's easement and also make sure homeowner consents to work

Item 6. Subventions Agreement. Adopt Resolution 2017-06 Approving and Authorizing Execution of Delta Levee Maintenance Subventions Program Work Agreement Fiscal Year 2017-2018. Dan Schroeder reported on this item. If Trustees choose to participate in the Levee Subventions Program, he is asking that the District allow Trustee Panzer to sign documents. After discussion,

It was moved, seconded (B. Tholborn/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that Resolution 2017-06 Approving and Authorizing Execution of Delta Levee Maintenance Subventions Program Work Agreement Fiscal Year 2017-2018 be be approved and that President Panzer execute the documents on behalf of the District.

Item 7. CEQA Exemption. Adopt Resolution 2017-07 Authorizing and Directing Filing of Notice of Exemption For Routine Maintenance. For Fiscal Year 2017-2018. After discussion

It was moved, seconded (B. Tholborn/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that Resolution 2017-07 Approving and Authorizing and Directing Filing of Notice of Exemption for Routine Maintenance, for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 be approved.

Item 8. District Website. Approve contract with MAYACO to update District website. Dan Schroeder reported on this item and said that the District's website is becoming unmanageable because of the amount of documents. It needs to be made easier for constituents to navigate it. He asked attorney Pinasco to do some research. A bid came in at a not to exceed \$2,500 to update the website. If a District has a website, the agendas have to have the most current agenda on the top of the list. Websites also need to be ADA compliant – in a design that meets the current standards of the ADA. The law firm of Neumiller & Beardslee currently does the monthly updates of the website. After discussion,

It was moved, seconded (B. Tholborn/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that the proposed contract to update the District website with MAYACO be approved with a cost not to exceed \$2,500.

Item 1. Public Comment. <u>Under Government Code Section 54954.3</u>, members of the public may address the Board on any item on the agenda as it is taken up. Mr. Gulli commented on election issue. He was directed to the notice published in the Stockton Record.

#### Item 2. Engineer's Report. Request for directions and approvals.

(a) Consider new permit requests from homeowners.
6201 Embarcadero Drive, Index No 17, Lot 1159, APN 098-370-01, permit for landscaping requested. Mr. Neudeck reported that he had received the completed permit application with acceptable plans from the homeowners addressing his prior concerns. He recommended approving the permit.

It was moved, seconded (D. Meyer/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that the permit application was approved with the conditions recommended by Mr. Neudeck.

(b) Authorize engineer to proceed with sediment removal project consultant contracts to perform design, survey, mapping environmental conditions and permitting. Mr. Neudeck reported on sediment removal project and the process on the permitting process with the design team. He discussed the disposal site and the problem with the original disposal/dewatering site due to it potentially being

unsuitable due to changes in conditions at the site. One alternative location is the Port of Stockton which already has a disposal site it uses for dredge spoils. The district would have to indemnify the port for any damage that occurred. District and port would have to enter into a disposal agreement and demonstrate that the spoils would not cause a problem. He then reported on the cost estimates contained in his August 29, 2017 letter to the District. He reported on the number of permits that will be pursued and the agencies where the permits will come from. He reported on the cost estimates in the proposal and the goal of getting the project started and completed in 2018. Mr. Neudeck requested that the Board authorize him to engage consultants set forth in the engineering proposed estimates. Mr. Gulli commented on cost issues and the proportion of costs attributable to the District Engineer and suggested contacting dredge operators for cost comparisons. He also threatened to sue District for not doing a request for qualification for the engineering services being provided by the District Engineer.

It was moved, seconded (D. Meyer/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that the District Engineer was authorized to move forward with the engineering and permit applications for the project.

Item 3. District Website. Approve contract with MAYACO to update District website. Mr. Pinasco reviewed the proposed revisions to the District;'s website and the proposal from MAYACO to perform the work. He also requested authority to make changes to the hosting service with GODADDY to address the need for additional changes in the website.

It was moved, seconded (D. Meyer/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 approving the contract with MAYACO, authorizing the President to sign the contract, and authorize staff to make necessary changes to the hosting of the site with GODADDY.

#### Agenda Items:

Item 1. <u>Public Comment</u>. <u>Under Government Code Section 54954.3</u>, members of the public may address the Board on any item on the agenda as it is taken up.

No comments were heard at this time. President Panzer indicated that during a Special Meeting that comments would be heard as each agenda item is presented below.

Item 2. Trustee Election. Discussion, approval and direction regarding the Election of Trustee.

a) Selection of November 7, 2017, election date and polling place within or near the District pursuant to *Water Code* § 50730 or selection of mail ballot election by adopting Resolution 2017-08 pursuant to *Water Code* § 50707.

Attorney Dan Schroeder said that the election code states in this case that the district's election must fall on November 7, 2017. He said that the board has been advised that if they have a contested election that a couple of things need to be decided:

- 1. If a polling place is desired, the district is required to have their polling hours between at least 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Exact polling hours need to be determined.
- 2. The water code for reclamation districts gives the Trustees the option of doing a mail ballot election. A mail ballot election would mean that there would be no polling place and everyone would receive their ballots in the mail and would have to mail or deliver them back. Mr. Schroeder said this option does not have to be followed, that it is just an option that is available for consideration.

Attorney Schroeder asked if anyone had questions.

Trustee Meyers confirmed the election date of November 7, 2017. Attorney Schroeder said that if the board decides on a mail ballot election that November 7<sup>th</sup> would not be the date and another date would need to picked. Attorney Schroeder said he would recommend November 9, 2017 as the mail ballot date. Trustee Meyers stated that when he ran for office that there was a polling place and he felt that was helpful for the public.

Mr. Gulli asked if candidates have a say as to which way the voting is held. President Panzer said Mr. Gulli is welcome to make his comment but that the Trustees vote on this issue.

Mr. Gulli asked if a general election was also being held on November 7<sup>th</sup> this year. President Panzer said no general/primary election will be held this year on that date.

Mr. Gulli also asked if votes could be delivered to the polling location or if voters have to personally show up and fill out their ballot when they arrive. Attorney Schroeder said there is a procedure for a proxy which a person could go through (he indicated he is not prepared to discuss this process at this meeting). Attorney Schroeder said that Mr. Gulli could look under *Water Code* §50730 for answers to this question.

Upon no more comments/questions:

It was moved, seconded (D. Meyers/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that a polling location be used for the November 7, 2017 election.

Attorney Schroeder indicated that his office is currently looking for a polling location and is waiting to get a response back from the person at the school district that is in charge of arranging this. He should have options for polling locations at the next board meeting in two weeks.

b) Selection of hours of poll(s) for the election pursuant to *Water Code* § 50705.

Attorney Schroeder stated that the polling place must be open between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. However, the board has the ability to begin as early as 7:00 a.m. and close the polls as late as 8:00 p.m. Attorney Schroeder said he believes that for the last district election that the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. were used. President Panzer indicated he prefers the extra time. Trustee Meyers agreed.

It was moved, seconded (D. Meyers/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that the polling hours for the November 7, 2017 election be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

c) Recommendations to San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors for appointment of Election Board pursuant to *Water Code §* 50700 et seq.

Attorney Schroeder indicated that since the district is conducting their own election that they need to have election officials. He had three individuals he recommended to the Trustees. These individuals have prior election experience. He also stated that the election is completely transparent and that the public will have the ability to observe the openings of the ballots.

Election officials recommended by Attorney Schroeder:

Inspector: Andrew J. Pinasco Judge: Jean L. Knight Judge: Rhonda L. Olmo

Attorney Schroeder presented Resolution 2017-08 (Resolution Nominating Individuals to the Election Board, Authorizing Preparation of the Certified Assessment Roll, and Direct Officials to Prepare Appropriate Notices and Documents for 2017 District Trustee Election) for the board to adopt. He said this resolution will then be forwarded to the Board of Supervisors for them to make the formal appointment.

It was moved, seconded (D. Meyers/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that the Board approve the election officials and adopt Resolution 2017-08 - Resolution Nominating Individuals to the Election Board, Authorizing Preparation of the Certified Assessment Roll, and Direct Officials to Prepare Appropriate Notices and Documents for 2017 District Trustee Election.

d) Preparation and certification of appropriate tax roll pursuant to Water Code § 50701.

Attorney Schroeder stated that the Water Code requires that the board prepare and certify an appropriate tax roll. He said this is the basis to use to determine who gets the ballots and who gets the vote. This needs to be done regardless of whether the district holds a polling place or mail ballot election. Attorney Schroeder recommended that the board direct the district's engineer to prepare and certify the tax roll.

It was moved, seconded (D. Meyers/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that the board direct the district's engineer to prepare and certify the tax roll.

e) Publishing of Election Notices pursuant to Water Code §§ 50731.5, 50732.

Attorney Schroeder said that the district is required to publish an Election Notice to notify the public of the election. This needs to be done at least weekly, four weeks before the election. Once a polling location is established that information will be included in the Notice.

It was moved, seconded (D. Meyers/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that the board direct the preparation of the Notice.

f) Direction to district engineer regarding election.

Attorney Schroeder stated that someone needs to prepare the ballots and someone needs to have the equipment in order to do the tallies. He recommended that the district engineer's office do this. Mr. Neudeck's office has done them on numerous elections that Attorney Schroeder has been involved with, and they have the expertise and experience.

It was moved, seconded (D. Meyers/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that the board direct the district engineer to prepare the ballots and assist in the election.

The Levee Rock Slope Project is almost complete. The additional rock added to the levee is helping to stabilize the slopes and the levee overall.


#### Scours and Boils

What is a scour? What is a boil?

Scour is the hole that is left when soil is washed away from the levee due to quick flowing water.

Boils occur when water passing under a levee crupts through the ground surface on the landward side of a levee in the form of a bubbling spring.

Scours and boils are potentially dangerous. If you notice any variation in the levee surfaces or soil next to the levees, please immediately call the Levee Superintendent. Leave a message, including a time when you are available to accompany the Superintendent to point out the problem area.



#### Permit Reminders

Remember to obtain a permit from the District before adding any landscaping or construction on or next to the levees. The Levee Superintendent can assist you in applying for and obtaining permits for landscaping or construction of any kind on or next to a levee.

#### Reminders

An Emergency Operations Plan is online. Please familiarize yourself with the plans at www.RD1608.com. Let us know if you have further unanswered questions.

#### Rodents and Other Intruders

The activities of rats, beavers, gophers, squirrels, and other animals can seriously endanger the integrity of our levees. These animals cannot be tolerated. If you see any of them, let Joe know.
