The City of Stockton, and San Joaquin County are jointly submitting, for your review and endorsement, a request for a Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) for Reclamation District No. 1608, Lincoln Village West, from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

Lincoln Village West is located within the City of Stockton and pockets of unincorporated areas of San Joaquin County. The combined community is bound by 14 Mile Slough on the west and south, 5 Mile Slough on the north and Plymouth Road on the east. It encompasses approximately 863 acres of residential, commercial, and public land uses and public services. Lincoln Village West uplands and manmade stormwater retention lakes are shown within a Zone X, and Zone A designation, respectively, on FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Maps, dated October 16, 2009 Panel No's. 06077C-0455F and 06077C-0315F. The 100-year flood plain elevations were obtained from the 1986 U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Hydrology Study and refined based on an analysis of historical gauging records for two gauging station situated within representative hydraulic conditions experienced by the Lincoln Village West levee system. The 100-year base flood elevation (BFE) is shown on the existing levee profile in the attached report. The existing levee exceeds 3 feet of freeboard above the BFE (surveyed in NAVD-88).

#### **TASK 1: PROJECT MANAGEMENT & DESIGN**

TASK BUDGET STATUS: \$18,476 (27% of task budget)







