Regardless I encouraged the Lichter's to go ahead and apply for Board consideration. Greg Wheatley of Spring Creek Pool & Spa is the contractor for this new pool.

HISTORICALLY, CALIFORNIA'S LARGEST FLOODS immediately follow droughts. That's why -- even during dry years -- it's important to remember that floods can and do happen. Fortunately, major flooding can often be prevented.

Levee Maintenance Reduces Risk of Flood Damage

RECLAMATION DISTRICT 1608 (RD 1608) is the public agency responsible for managing flood risk for Lincoln Village West. The community is bordered by waterways on three sides (see map). To reduce the chance of flooding, RD 1608 takes care of ("maintains & operates") 3.5 miles of levees that act as a barrier to flooding from these waterways. These levees are Lincoln Village West's only defense against flooding from the Delta.

Damage to levees caused by erosion, rodents and vegetation can lead to a levee breach (failure) and uncontrolled flooding. A failure of any of the Lincoln Village West levees could result in flood depths of up to 9 feet throughout the community. This would cause approximately \$2 billion in property damages. To prevent flood damage, RD 1608:

- Conducts daily inspections of levees and performs routine repairs as necessary, including placing rock slope protection (riprap), filling burrows from rodents, repairing all weather road surfaces, clearing and trimming vegetation, and removing other man made and natural encroachments (e.q. structures and vegetation that prevent levee inspection).



How do levees fail?

What is 100-year **Flood Protection?** Why is it important?

LINCOLN VILLAGE WEST LEVEES ARE **CURRENTLY ACCREDITED** by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) as providing a 100-year level of flood protection (protection against a flood event that has a one percent chance of happening in any given year). This means Lincoln Village West is currently "mapped" by FEMA as a low to moderate risk flood zone. As a result, property owners are not subject to mandatory flood insurance requirements or FEMA-related building restrictions. This saves property owners millions of dollars each year.

What is "levee maintenance?"

RD 1608 EMPLOYS ONE FULL-TIME SUPERINTENDENT and provides part-time employment for up to four maintenance workers. RD 1608's ongoing levee operations and maintenance activities generally include:

- Routine inspection of levees and drainage facilities
- Removal of debris that obstructs flood flows, or otherwise damages levees
- Maintenance of channel depth to provide access to marine mounted equipment (material and crane barges)
- Vegetation removal and control
- Rodent removal and control
- Levee patrol during high water warning and flood stages
- Resurfacing of levee maintenance and patrol roads
- Construction of erosion repair and protection
- Repair of levee embankments

How is RD 1608 funded?

RD 1608's FISCAL YEAR 2022-23 BUDGET is approximately \$825,000. RD 1608 is funded through a property assessment and percentage of your property taxes. The property assessment, which accounts for approximately half the district's revenues, is set to expire in 2025. The district is planning an early 2024 Prop 218 balloting for an assessment renewal.

Dear Mr. Quintero,

We, the Board of Trustees for RD 1608, are reaching out to you today to request help in managing the invasive aquatic weed problem in Fourteen Mile Slough in Stockton, California.

RD 1608 is responsible for maintaining and managing the levee system in the vicinity of the southern portion of Fourteen Mile Slough in Stockton. We are an urban district whose mission is to protect the public and property values landward of the levees. Accordingly, we inspect the levee system to maintain visibility, ensure compliance with our permitting standards, and we recently completed a two-million dollar dredging project to ensure navigational waterways in the slough, a project that was awarded the American Civil Engineering Best Small Project award in 2021. Our intent is to ensure that in the event of a flood and potential levee failure, the slough will be easily accessed by barge and boat to shore up weaker points along the levee.

As shown in the enclosed photographs, invasive aquatic weeds are rapidly growing in the slough, particularly in the waterway cuts between the tule islands berns that are at the center of Fourteen Mile Slough. Keeping these waterways and cuts clear of vegetation is of primary importance, as clear waterway and cuts allow better hydraulic communication between both reaches of the slough, as well as allowing easier barge access in the event of a flood. Additionally, the weeds currently growing in the waterway cuts act as a nursery for more weeds, resulting in a never-ending, self-perpetuating problem.

We are reaching out to you today because we are neither authorized, permitted, nor capable of removing the invasive aquatic weeds in the slough. We rely on the Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW) to perform that function for us. In prior years, DBW has met with some success in managing the invasive species, but this year spraying appears to have been reduced to almost nothing and has scarcely been observed by residents along the slough all summer. As RD 1608 has neither the authority nor expertise to remove the invasive weeds ourselves we are asking you to ensure that our levee is cleared of this vegetation that threatens our safety.
