MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES

FOR RECLAMATION DISTRICT 1608 HELD ON WEDNESDAY, MARCH 1, 2023

A Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 was called to order at 8:00 a.m. by President Panzer on March 1, 2023, at the law offices of Neumiller & Beardslee, 3121 W. March Lane, Suite 100, Stockton, California.

1. Public Comment.

- Mr. Gulli commented he was not aware there was going to be a Prop 218 SJAFCA presentation and stated he did not see it on the agenda. In response to Mr. Gulli's comment, Mr. Pinasco clarified that the presentation was part of Agenda Item 7 in an effort to differentiate between SJAFCA's Prop 218 election and the District's Prop 218 election. Ms. Floyd explained this will further provide direction for Prop 218 outreach and for the next newsletter.
- Mr. Bentz commented he does not know much about the SJAFCA proposal. He is not opposed to what the District is doing but is confused about Prop 218.
- 2. Approval of Minutes. Minutes of the regular meeting of February 1, 2023. The Trustees reviewed the draft minutes. After review,

It was moved, seconded (D. Lofstrom/D. MacDonnell) and unanimously carried by the Board Trustees of Reclamation District 1608, that the minutes of the February 1, 2023, be approved as presented.

3. **Financial Report**. Review, discuss, and accept financial report. District Secretary Elvia Trujillo presented an oral and written report and reported on the registered warrants. After review,

It was moved, seconded (D. MacDonnell/D. Lofstrom) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 that the Final Financial Report presented at the March 1, 2023, meeting be approved.

4. Audit. Accept Audit Report for year ended June 30, 2022.

Attorney Andy Pinasco presented this item. The draft audit report was reviewed and presented at the last meeting and it is now in final form with no changes.

After review,

It was moved, seconded (D. Lofstrom/D. MacDonnell) and unanimously carried by the Trustees of Reclamation District 1608, that the Audit Report for the year ended June 30, 2022 be accepted.

5. Insurance. Approve Insurance Policy for 2023/2024 insurance year.

Attorney Andy Pinasco reported the insurance coverage year is from April to April. He has asked the insurance company for comparison figures but has not yet received that information. He noted there was an increase from \$13,554 to \$19,375 and will also be inquiring as to this increase. In addition, Mr. Pinasco is working on issues related to the auto policy. Since not all the information was available for this meeting, Mr. Pinasco recommends the Board delegates authority to the President to approve the insurance policy prior to the next meeting in order to maintain coverage. After discussion, President Panzer delegated authority to Andy Pinasco.

It was moved, seconded (D. Lofstrom/D. MacDonnell) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608, to delegate authority to Attorney Andy Pinasco to review insurance information and make the final decision to approve insurance coverage for the year April 1, 2023 to April 1, 2024.

6. Workers Compensation Insurance. Approve Workers' Compensation Policy for 2023/2024 insurance year. Attorney Andy Pinasco presented this item. He reported the workers' compensation insurance policy with State Compensation Insurance Fund is up for renewal. Mr. Pinasco recommends the Board renews coverage with State Compensation Insurance Fund to maintain coverage.

It was moved, seconded (D. MacDonnell/D. Lofstrom) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608, that workers' compensation insurance coverage be

renewed with State Compensation Insurance Fund for the 2023/2024 insurance year.

7. **Prop 218 Assessment.** Review, discuss, provide direction for Prop 218 outreach. SJAFCA gave a presentation of their upcoming assessments so that the Trustees could understand the impacts it will have on this District's planned assessment. SJAFCA provided both a written and oral report.

Next, Kim Floyd reported on the development of the next newsletter. A draft letter is currently being worked on. The levees did well during the storm, and this is a good reminder that investing in maintaining the levees really does work. Based on today's presentation from SJAFCA, the newsletter will be refined and sent to the Trustees for comments. Mr. Pinasco recommends approval of the newsletter subject to Trustee comments.

It was moved, seconded (D. Lofstrom/D. MacDonnell) and unanimously carried by the Trustees of Reclamation District 1608, that the Newsletter be approved subject to Trustee comments

Attorney Andy Pinasco reported this item was brought back for discussion. The Board reconvened from Closed Session at 9:42 a.m. During the Closed Session, President Panzer and Trustee Lofstrom were present with Trustee MacDonnell leaving at 9:31 a.m. There was no reportable action regarding Items 17.A and 17.B.

18. **Employee Contracts.** Discussion and possible action regarding changes to Levee Superintendent and District Secretary contracts. Attorney Andy Pinasco presented this item. He addressed the Board by saying this is the opportunity to discuss whether there

are any changes to be made to the Levee Superintendent Contract and the District Secretary Contract. He stated the Federal cost of living is at 8.7 percent and the CPI 6.4 percent. Discussion followed and a compensation increased was approved for both the Levee Superintendent and District Secretary. For the Levee Superintendent, an increase of 7.5% from \$44.00 per hour to \$47.30 per hour was approved. For the District Secretary, an increase of 7.5% from \$55.00 per hour to \$59.13 per hour was approved.

It was moved, seconded (D. Lofstrom/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 to authorize the President to exercise amendment to the Levee Superintendent Contract increasing the hourly rate by 7.5 % from \$44.00 to \$47.30 per hour.

It was moved, seconded (D. Lofstrom/M. Panzer) and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees of Reclamation District 1608 to authorize the President to exercise amendment to the District Secretary Contract increasing the hourly rate by 7.5% from \$55.00 per hour to \$59.13 per hour.
